At the invitation of the Albert Berner Foundation, pre-school children from the Garnberg Kindergarten will also attend and will certainly be excited when Punch and Seppel chase the rascal who robbed Grandmother’s coffee grinder. Berner employees had a nice surprise in store for the boys and girls: free tickets for the performance in the city hall. A visit to the kindergarten showed that the new generation is well-prepared for the play. For example, a poster of the performance hangs on the wall. And naturally, there is also a copy of the classic children’s book on the bookshelf for story hour.

“We regularly attend the children’s theater, so we were delighted to receive an invitation from the Albert Berner Foundation,” says Ariane Pfitzer, Garnberg Kindergarten Director. “If the weather is nice, we can combine the excursion with a walk in town.” After the perfor-

During the Advent season, for example, a collaborative cookie-baking campaign was held in the restaurant at the company's headquarters. The cookies were sold to Berner employees at the traditional Christmas party, with a portion of the proceeds being donated to the kindergarten. The facility used the funds to purchase a mobile beverage and backpack cart. This means refreshments for the children are always ready to hand – a major benefit, especially in summer temperatures!
